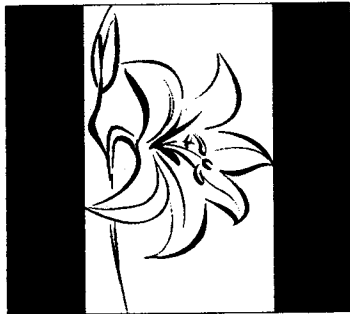

The 2003 Pool Season will be here before we know it! Pool Pass Registration will begin this year on Saturday, March 22, beginning at 9:30 am and ending at 1:30 pm. Each year many residents come to the registrations completely unprepared to obtain or renew their passes, despite the best efforts of the Board to inform them. Please read the following information carefully. This will answer any questions you may have, if you only take the time to review it thoroughly.

Please note that like last year, the registration form that you *must complete* to get your passes will be mailed with the Annual Meeting information and proxies. For insurance reasons, you are **REQUIRED** to fill this form out every year. To save everyone time, please have that form filled out when you come to registration.

Please **DO NOT** mail your passes in to C.I.A. Services. Pool passes will be taken care of at one of

the 5 pool pass registration dates.

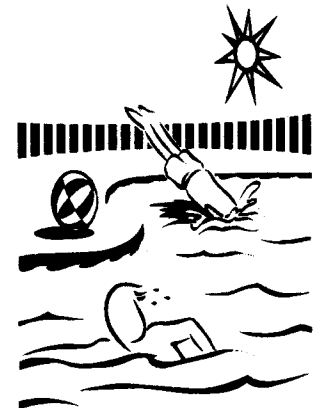
If you are a current pool pass holder, current on association dues, you need only to bring your existing pool passes and your registration form. Your passes will be punched with the 2003 punch and will be validated for this season. If your card is now "all punched out", you will need to have new passes made for everyone in your home age 3 and over. Please note that if you have a damaged card, one that is unreadable, it will be replaced free of charge. However, if you just want a new pass because you don't like the picture on your existing one, you will be charged a \$5 replacement fee.

If you are a new resident, have never had a pool pass or your pass has completely expired, please see the "Resident Passes" section on page 14 for information on what you need to obtain your passes.

Please also understand that if you do not make arrangements to get your passes at one of these **FIVE** pool pass registration dates, and you wish to get passes anytime after 3 pm on May 3, you **WILL** be charged a \$15 late charge per family unless you have moved in after this time.

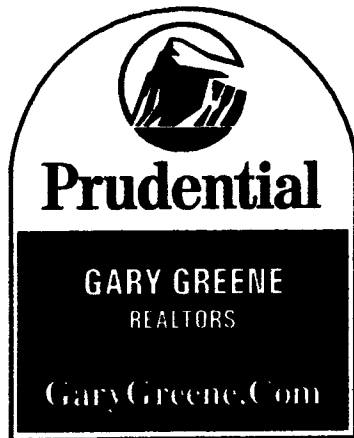

SUMMARY OF WATER DISTRICT BOARD ACTIONS
JANUARY 2003-FEBRUARY 2003**

JANUARY 9, 2003

At its January 9, 2003 meeting the Board of Directors of the District reviewed a \$29,000 invoice from Cypress Forest P.U.D. for the District's share of costs for certain repairs to a major sanitary sewer trunk line to the regional sewage treatment plant. The Board directed the Engineer for the District look into the matter and confirm that the invoice was in the correct amount.

The Board was informed that a new professional building was to be constructed within the District, and the Operator confirmed the commercial tap fees, which were to be paid by the Developer. The Operator and the Board then reviewed maintenance items and the Board directed that a grinder pump be installed at the Champion Springs sewage lift station in accordance with the recommendations of the Operator.

The Board then heard a detailed report from the District's Operator, who informed the Board that there were 1,379 active connections in the District and that the District had a 98.5% water accountability figure for the month. The Board was also informed that there had been a sewage line stoppage on Town Terrace which had been repaired, and that the regional sewer plant serving the District had operated within permit for the month with no major problems.

FEBRUARY 13, 2003

At its February 13, 2003 meeting the

Board of Directors of the District reviewed invoices for monthly charges to the District for various services and products required by the District in the operation of its water and sewage systems. The District's Engineer reported on his study of the \$29,000 invoice from Cypress Forest P.U.D., and stated that the correct amount of the invoice was \$16,770, which had resulted in a cost saving to the District of \$12,229. The Engineer went on to report that the previous invoice for \$29,000 had been calculated by the Cypress Forest P.U.D. engineers using an incorrect formula for the division of repair costs for the joint line.

The Board then heard a report from the Developer of a proposed new section of development in the District on the south side of Louetta Road, who requested and received the Board's authorization to seek construction bids for the water, sewer and drainage facilities necessary to serve Section 2 of his new development. The Board also approved the utility development and reimbursement agreement with the Developer for Section 2.

The Board then reviewed a written report from the District's Tax Collector/Assessor and established tax exemptions for the 2003 tax year for those taxpayers who are 65 years of age or older, or who are disabled.

The Board then received a report from

the Engineer and Developer concerning a proposed new development project which is in the process of being annexed by the District. The Developer reported that an additional 3/4 of an acre was to be added to the project and the Board approved adding this property to the District when the District annexes the balance of the development. The Board then received a report from another Developer who is going to purchase the 5.7 acres behind the Amazing Spaces development (which is within the District) and who proposed to develop single-family lots for a new housing project. The Board authorized the District's Engineer to review this matter to ensure that the District's facilities had sufficient capacity to provide adequate service for the new project.

The Board then received the monthly Operations Report, which stated that the District had a 99.4% water accountability figure for the month, with a 99.1% water accountability average for the past four months. The Board then reviewed with the Operator the necessity of making repairs to the sanitary sewer line along Colony Creek and the Operator agreed to make all such repairs to this line as soon as possible.

The meeting is usually less than an hour in length, and is really pretty interesting. There is an open forum in which you are able to ask or say anything on your mind pertaining to

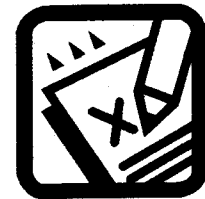

Trash Processing

Trash cans must be within 3 feet of the curb on trash day. TEW is not required to process garbage left beyond 3 feet.

Daddy O's Kitchen Good Eats Made Simple

Good Eats Made Simple

Ok Dads, time to get out of the recliner, and give Mom a break. This issue will be easy, fun, and once again you will be the hero of the day!

Meatloaf and Twice baked Potatoes

We will need for this Recipe:

- 2 Extra large Idaho baking potatoes
- 1 cup milk
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- Garlic, chives, basil, and thyme
- 2 large onions
- 4 pounds ground chuck
- 1 bottle ketchup
- 1 sleeve saltine crackers
- Half stick butter
- 3 eggs

Let's Get To Work

In a large bowl, combine ground chuck, eggs, 1 ½ diced onions, 1 sleeve crushed crackers, tablespoon garlic powder, teaspoon thyme, salt and pepper, 1/3 squeeze bottle of ketchup. Form the mix into 2 loaf shapes in baking pans. Paint on a layer of ketchup on the outside of each loaf. Cover well (with ketchup). Bake at 350 degrees until outer edges are brown and starting to crisp at the bottom edges, (usually about an hour).

Microwave your potatoes (wet), for about 15 minutes, or until tender, in plastic bags with little fork holes punched in them to let the steam out. Transfer to 350 degree oven to crisp the skin up and create the shell for your twice

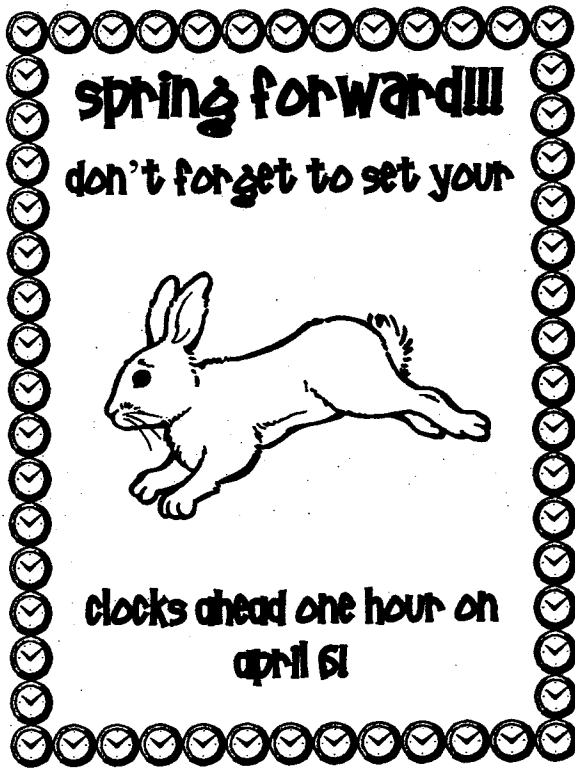
baked potatoes. When crisp, remove, and cut lengthwise. Scoop out potato and set aside shells. Add milk, ½ stick butter, 1 cup cheese, tablespoon chives, teaspoon garlic powder, ¼ minced onion, and a sprinkle of thyme. Mash and mix well. Return the mix to the shells, and top with remaining cheese. Bake for 20 minutes, or until cheese just has a hint of getting golden brown.

It's about timing

Of course, you will have to time this all, so it comes out hot and ready to eat together.

Serve with your family's favorite veggie, and take a bow. Note: No matter what your kids tell you, Ice Cream is NOT a vegetable!

- ⇒ No fee to receive a new pass.
- ⇒ New passes require a small picture (approximately 1"x1") for each individual family member ages 3 and up. This picture can be a photocopy of your driver's license picture, a cut out of a snapshot, etc. This photo will be laminated on to the pool pass.
- ⇒ An adult 18 years or older with a valid photo I.D. must be present to return the Pool Membership Form and Rules that will be sent with your proxies by mail. Children may not pick up the passes.

- ⇒ Guest passes have no expiration date, so they can be used next year, or you can use those you purchased in the years past for the 2003 season.
- ⇒ The cost is \$1 per guest per day. If you have a guest staying for an extended period of time, please let us know. We can work with you.
- ⇒ Guest passes may be purchased in \$5 and \$10 increments. We accept cash and checks made out to C.C.V.C.A.
- ⇒ Guests may not access pool area unless passes are present and a member accompanies a guest.

Resident Passes

⇒ Must be current on association dues to receive passes. (Please note that if you are not current on dues, we will be UNABLE to accept payment at the time of the registration. You must take care of this through C.I.A. Services.)

Guest Passes

- ⇒ Please purchase your guest passes when you renew your 2003 pool passes.
- ⇒ Guest passes will not be available at the pool for immediate use after the final registration date, so please purchase yours in advance.

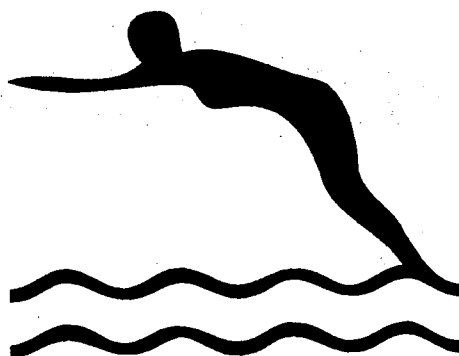
